Call to Order

Chairman Brown called the meeting to order at 8:05am.

Supt. Garrett gave an overview of local education priorities:

- Universal Pre-K—blending funding to accomplish a better Pre-K system; and not every child needs Pre-K
- USDA Universal Feeding—23families will have to pay for school meals
- Needs Based School Construction Grant—thankful to the Legislature for their approval of the grants; appreciative of the availability of the lottery money; looking at capital needs for the lottery money
- Staff Retention—4th best retention rate in the state; 3% supplement achieved for teachers and an extra \$1500 bonus
- One to One Initiative—first district in the state to partner with Google for laptops; 6th-12th grades have repurposed old devices for younger ages and have supplied devices for all ages, which really helped during the pandemic
- Broadband—multiple areas are without coverage; partnered with churches to supply internet during the pandemic

• School Calendar—requested to be aligned with the community colleges, which would work best for the students

Following the presentation, there was a legislative discussion among the attendees.

Chairman Brown recognized two retiring Board of Education members, Bob Brackett and Brian Piercy. Neither would be seeking re-election.

Vice Chairman Walker made a motion to adjourn at 9:50am, second by Commissioner Ellis. By a vote of 5-0 the meeting was adjourned.
