DECLARATION of a LOCAL STATE OF EMERGENCY McDOWELL COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA

August 16, 2021

WHEREAS, COVID-19 is a serious communicable disease that can result in serious illness or death; and

WHEREAS, in response to the global spread of the virus and the disease it causes, the World Health Organization (WHO) has declared COVID-19 a Public Health Emergency of International Concern; the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has warned of the high public health threat posed by COVID-19 globally and in the United States; the United States Department of Health and Human Services Secretary declared a public health emergency in the United States for COVID-19; and the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services (NCDHHS) confirmed multiple cases of COVID-19 in North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, the Chairman of the McDowell County Board of Commissioners declared a State of Emergency in McDowell County, including the Town of Old Fort on March 17, 2020 and activated the County's Emergency Operations Plan; and

WHEREAS, that State of Emergency was previously discontinued due to improved conditions; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners have previously indicated that they will make adjustments to County operations, directives, and declarations as necessary, including the possibility of reinstituting a State of Emergency.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority contained in the McDowell County State of Emergency Ordinance and under Article 1A of Chapter 166A and 36A of Chapter 14 of North Carolina General Statutes, and under the McDowell County Emergency Operations Plan; I hereby declare a **State of Emergency** exists for McDowell County and the Town of Old Fort.

Further, I hereby request that all persons within the geographical limits of McDowell County follow CDC recommendations for mitigating the spread of COVID-19 in the community.

Further, I direct that copies of the Declaration be distributed to the news media for publication and broadcast; a copy be posted on the County's website; and that a copy be filed with the Clerk to the Board of McDowell County Commissioners.

This Declaration shall become effective at 5pm on August 16, 2021 until rescinded pursuant to NCGS 166A-19.22(c).
